About Japan Nuclear Disaster Aid Association (a.k.a. 311 Ukeire Zenkoku)

Many "accept-and-welcome aid activities" began across Japan after the 2011 Tokyo Electric Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant accident. In September 2012, we created an expansive network connecting aid groups across Japan, offering information and holding consultation sessions to those who are worried about their children's health. There have been a steady number of people wishing recuperation or relocation, given the continuing nature of the accident and the failure of decontamination to completely remove radioactive contamination from the every day environment. Yet with passing time, various resources such as donations and grants have been drying up, and we feel that people are beginning to think "The effects from the accident are over."

That is why we think it is important to deliver voices of people from the disaster affected areas all over the nation to learn what types of support are needed now through our network. Not limiting ourselves to offering information, we are putting our effort towards developing the aid which fulfills the needs. In addition, we share experiences of aid providers to deepen what the aid offers on a daily basis.

How "311 Ukeire Zenkoku" was created: In February 2012 when over 100 groups from across Japan gathered at the "National Summit to Protect Lives from Radiation" in Fukushima City. They reached a consensus, "This work must continue," and began deepening grassroots cooperation.

1.Consultation Session Working Group

Holds consultation sessions in the nuclear disaster affected areas for recuperation, relocation, and health.

2.Recuperation Promotion Working Group

Increases availability of "recuperation" and sends information to those in need.

3.Send-Off Team "Everyone's Hope" Working Group

Provides aid groups from all across Japan with information about and wishes from the Nuclear disaster affected areas to connect aid groups with those in need of aid.

4."Everyone's Hope"Fund Working Group

Organizes funding and training projects in order to continue and improve recuperation.

5.Mobile Classroom and Boarding School Working Group Works directly with schools and local

Works directly with schools and local governments in order to coordinate mid- to long-term group recuperation.

6.Relocation Working Group

Shares information about relocation aid and connects those wishing to relocate with the network.
